
Methodology:

- Data shows:
 - > ICCS cases from year 2015 to 2018, and
 - > **ICCS/COM** cases from year 2017 to 2018.
- Data indicates the average number of days taken by the court to resolve or dispose a case from filing of writ to enforcement.
- Data is analysed to compare whether or not the court has reach the time standard procedures and according to Practice Direction guidelines of 1 of 2017.
- o Targeted number of days for all stages (from Filing to Execution) is **578 days**
- \circ $\;$ Total average number of days for all stages in each year*
 - > 2015 **1694 days**
 - ➢ 2016 − 1344 days
 - ➢ 2017 − 1417 days
 - > 2017 (COMM) **819 days**
 - > 2018 **146 days**
 - > 2018 (COMM) **185 days**
- All ICCS (Intermediate court civil cases) and ICCS/COM (Intermediate court civil cases/Commercial) are as of 31st August 2018.




